# KMR protects and restores the Kaipara Moana

An estimated 700,000 tonnes of sediment flow into the Moana each year – seven times the natural rate.

Sediment smothers riverbeds and the seabed and reduces light in waterways, with significant effects on fish, shellfish and plant life.

It also reduces the recreational, cultural, environmental and economic values of the Kaipara Moana that are important to communities across the catchment.

# KMR supports people, places and nature

KMR invests in projects to restore wetlands, fence off rivers and streams, plant trees and regenerate forest on erosion-prone land. These important actions create many benefits. They:

# KMR is delivering strong results

Just over two and a half years into operational delivery, KMR has supported over 800 landowners and groups to develop project plans and take action on the ground.



#### Jobs and Skills

- **173 people** are now trained through KMR investment, many from local iwi/hapū
- New work has been created in rural communities
  equal to a full year of work for over 200 people
- \$19.2 million support for sediment reduction projects, supporting local, nature-based employment



### **Engagement and Participation**

- 1100 landowners and groups have expressed interest in being involved in KMR
- 723 project plans have been completed with landowners and groups, with a further 81 in development
- 74 projects led by hapū, marae, community groups, catchment groups or other collectives are completed, underway or in development



#### **Nature**

- Over 1.93 million plants are in the ground or contracted to plant
- 546 hectares of planting has been completed or contracted
- 242 hectares of native forests have been protected, or are contracted to be protected, through regeneration projects
- 839 kilometres of fencing has been completed or contracted (the same distance as from Cape Rēinga to Napier)
- Around 130,000 hectares are now managed under KMR plans
